WHEREAS, the City of Cromwell held a special vote on split liquor. Sixty-five (65) persons voted by mail-in ballot with 0 persons voting in person for a total of 65 persons voting;

WHEREAS, on this 16th day of August, 2017, the City Council met to canvass said voting results;

WHEREAS, the votes tabulated at said election were:

50 Yes votes
15 No votes

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the City of Cromwell that the City Council be allowed to issue private on-sale licenses for the sale of intoxicating liquor to hotels and restaurants, as well as to clubs.



**RESOLUTION 11.2.03
HOURS AND DAYS OF SALE**

Due to new legislation, Ordinance 11.2.03 is repealed and replaced as follows:

(A) The hours of operation and days of sale shall be those set by Minn. Stat. § 340A.504, as it may be amended from time to time, except that the City Council may, by resolution or ordinance, provide for more restrictive hours than state law allows.


(B) No person shall consume nor shall any on-sale licensee permit any consumption of intoxicating liquor or 3.2 percent malt liquor in an on-sale licensed premises more than 30 minutes after the time when a sale can legally occur.

(C) No on-sale licensee shall permit any glass, bottle, or other container containing intoxicating liquor or 3.2 percent malt liquor to remain upon any table, bar, stool, or other place where customers are served, more than 30 minutes after the time when a sale can legally occur.


(D) No person, other than the licensee and any employee, shall remain on the on-sale licensed premises more than 30 minutes after the time when a sale can legally occur.

(E) Any violation of any condition of this section may be grounds for revocation or suspension of the license.




BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council for the City of Cromwell, County of Carlton, State of Minnesota, as follows:



TO CONSIDER issuing a private on-sale liquor license.


THEREFORE, a special election will be held on August 8, 2017, and

COUNCIL MEMBER POSITION**


BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council and Mayor of the City of Cromwell, Minnesota, as follows:

WHEREAS, and it is necessary for the Cromwell City Council to declare that this position is vacant in order to fill this vacancy.


NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Cromwell, that one position for Council Member is open and to be appointed.

CITY OF CROMWELL, CARLTON COUNTY, MN


BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council and Mayor of the City of Cromwell, Minnesota, as follows:
